Requirements on products, data sheets, hazardous projects, transportation, packaging, documentation, training, and equipment testing.

Lithium batteries pose a fire hazard, even when they are no longer useful in consumer equipment/products. Damaged, defective, or recalled batteries have greater potential than undamaged lithium batteries to short circuit, to release heat, or even to cause a fire. Misused, mishandled, modified, improperly packaged, improperly stored, overcharged, damaged, or defective lithium cells or batteries can short circuit, overheat, and sometimes cause fire. Attendees will learn how to safely use, handle, and store lithium batteries.

By Law, the Florida Fire Prevention Code (FFPC) must be adopted by the State Fire Marshal at three-year (triennial) intervals as required by Florida Statute Chapter 633.202. This seminar will cover the Statutory process and history of the FFPC, the minimum uniform codes and standards adopted and incorporated into the FFPC, the process to implement local fire code amendments to the FFPC, the applicability and process for interpretations and declaratory statements to the FFPC, exemptions to the FFPC, the Florida Fire Code Advisory Council, and a review of Florida Rule Chapter 69A-60, 69A-36, 69A-38, and other adopted Rules referenced in the FFPC, as well as adopted NFPA Codes and Standards.

3:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m. Florida Fire Prevention Code 8th Edition changes specific to the Fire Equipment Industry

Presented by John Gioseffi, Broward Fire Equipment and Service, Inc.

The Florida Fire Prevention Code (FFPC) is adopted by the State Fire Marshal at three-year intervals as required by Chapter 633.202, Florida Statutes. The 8th edition of the Florida Fire Prevention Code was adopted as of December 23, 2023. This seminar will review and discuss changes from the 7th edition that directly relate to the Fire Equipment Industry in the State of Florida. Changes to NFPA 1, NFPA 101, NFPA 96, NFPA 17, NFPA 17A and other adopted and incorporated Codes and Standards will be included.
